Make a catch of fish to show what happens when Jesus calls his first disciples.

What you need:

- Cardboard egg carton
- Acrylic paint
- Paintbrush
- Darning needle
- Fishing twine
- Scissors
- Googly eyes or buttons
- Glue



What you do:


- 1. From the egg carton, cut out the 12 cups. From the lid, cut out two fish tails.
- On a protected surface, turn the cups upside down. Paint the outside of each cup and both sides of the tails. Let dry.
- 3. Thread the needle with an arm's length of twine. Tie a knot at the end.
- 4. Thread the needle through the end of the tail. Tie another knot an inch from the tail.
- 5. Thread the needle through one upside-down cup. Pull the twine through until the cup rests on the knot.
- 6. Continue tying knots an inch above each cup and threading on another cup until you've strung six cups. Tie a knot above the last cup and leave a long string to hang the fish. (You can make two fish with each egg carton.)
- 7. Add googly eyes or buttons to the last cup to make a face.



Christmas means more tweets!

Wow, this quarter is winding down quickly. Here is another tweet-format rundown of Gifford goings-on!

#Blanca – The boss is in Honduras for three weeks, visiting family and taking care of some legal documents. Please pray for her time there and for her return on December 17.

#Preaching in Paradise – November 13-18 I co-led a Timothy module on Biblical Preaching for the Gulf Coast presbytery in Paraíso, Tabasco. The training and preaching I did went well, and thankfully the tropical storm headed our way petered out.



#Pivoting for the children – The lack of available volunteers has kept Blanca from restarting the children's ministry at Jesús el Salvador church. Blanca is now helping a ministry called Corazón Valiente (Brave heart), which reaches out to the children of the indigenous people who sell their goods in Coyoacán. She is taking part every Thursday afternoon. (no pics allowed for this ministry)

CM UPDATE

END OF YEAR 2024


The 2024-2025 school year started off as the whirlwind it always seems to be! This kickoff season was marked by a wave of students particularly driven to invite everyone they encountered into what God is doing at CM. Between our annual first-day-of-school Cookout & Carnival, many ultimate frisbee nights, some sand volleyball, a kickoff worship service, a tailgate, a beach night, and another Mystery Roadtrip for Life Group Night Out, our presence on campus and around the city of Grand Rapids (and the Lord's presence before and behind it all) is undeniable!



Our weekly Sunday night worship services, The Well, happen in a 230-seat auditorium in the middle of campus (The Cook-DeWitt Center) in Allendale. We are averaging about 600 students each week across our three services—6pm & 8pm in Allendale, and 7 pm in GR. Our Grand Rapids community holds a core group of 70 students who are living missionally in the city as well as on campus. Our sermon series for the semester is "Through Galilee with Jesus" as we study the book of Mark. Students want to be at The Well. Nobody is making them come. They are simply drawn in by the Spirit of God, and filled with life and joy and passion during worship.

God continues to move powerfully at The Well week after week through worship songs, biblical teaching, and 2-minute student testimony of how they've seen God work in their lives. You can watch some of these stories on our website! In addition to an increase in attendance at The Well, we have over 600 students involved in our weekly Life Groups (Allendale) and House Groups (Grand Rapids) this year—100 more than last! This year, we already have 250 people signed up to serve on a CM Spring Break Service Trip, and over 300 students engaged in the first ever Life Group Serve Week in partnership with 616 Service. Students are hungry to learn about God and to serve Him in all areas of their life.

We are constantly seeing students go from death to life, from captivity to freedom, and from fear to confidence in the Lord's sovereignty and strength. The stories we hear every single week are just jaw-dropping, and we are expectant of what the Lord will continue to do in this generation of students and the generations to come.







2. The fetus is not fully human because it is dependent on another (the mother). "Is a baby kangaroo not a kangaroo because it lives in its mother's pouch? Of course not. The location and situation of a human being does not make him or her any less human. These type of arguments based on dependence tread on dangerous ground. If dependency makes a person less human, then on that ground we would have the right to kill infants outside the womb, people on dialysis, those who use wheelchairs or oxygen, and the elderly. May we kill all depended people? NO and that is very reminisce of the Nazi party during WW2.

Consider two mothers several months into their pregnancies. One child is born prematurely, and the other remains in the womb. The first is utterly dependent on medical intervention to survive, and the other on her mother's body. Is it right to kill the prematurely born baby? How would the hospital staff react if the mother entered the neonatal ward with a scissors or saline or a pill to kill her child? If it is NOT right to kill the premature child, then why is it right to kill the child in the womb? BOTH ARE DEPENDENT, BOTH ARE CHILDREN, BOTH MUST HAVE LEGAL PROTECTION!!

3. A women has a right to do with her body as she desires. We affirm a woman's authority over her OWN body, but there are limits to what we can rightfully do with our bodies, including causing harm to another human being and abortion involves the DEATH of her child. To argue that the living fetus is part of the mother's body defies rea-

When the unborn child's heart beats, whose heart is it? When the unborn baby/fetus's brain waves can be traced, whose brain is it? Every pregnancy involves TWO people, the mother and the child; the rights of BOTH must be considered. Whenever we speak of the rights of two human beings, me must guard against the more powerful person taking advantage of the much weaker one, it's the responsibility of the stronger one to protect the weaker one! Does any mother have the right to do whatever she pleases with her children? Are they allowed to neglect them? Are they allowed to beat them? Are they allowed to kill them? Are they allowed to destroy them? The answer is NO to all these, she has the responsibility of caring for them or seeing that someone else cares for them.

YES motherhood calls for a sacrifice, we should expect adults to make sacrifices of their resources and freedoms when necessary to preserve the lives of children.

LIFE. The Other Choice!

4 & 5 of 7 Arguments for abortion and responses to those arguments.

Sex and reproduction are private matters into which we must not intrude: We believe the human sexuality is a very private matter; it express the deep intimacy that a husband and wife share. But sex has very public consequences. How we exercise our sexuality contribute to the restraint or spread of disease, the treatment of women with honor or rape, the nurture or sexual abuse of children, and the strengthening or dissolution of families which is the foundation of society. Society therefore has a compelling interest to guard the dignity of marriage, women, and children with respect to sex and reproduction. Many people argue that the U.S. Constitution guarantees the right to privacy in sexual and reproductive matters, but if read the constitution we would not find any such right there. The reality is that under the 4th Amendment, it acknowledges the right to security against "unreasonable searches and seizures" without a warrant, but says nothing about sexuality, children nor abortion. Some might even snidely say, "I thought what I did in my bedroom was my own business". But if there is reasonable cause to believe you are murdering child in your bedroom, then it becomes a matter of public intervention by the authorities.

PRIVACY IS NOT AN ABOSULUTE MORAL RIGHT, BUT KILLING A CHILD IS AN ABSOLUTE MORAL WRONG! Making abortion illegal would force women into dangerous, back-alley abortions: This idea has been widely used as an excuse for a crudely done abortion. But the reality of it is that 90 percent of abortions performed before they became legal were done by physicians in their offices. The lie told that thousands of women died annually before abortion was legalized has been proven false. In 1972 (before Roe v. Wade) 39 women died in the US from an illegal abortion. Even the American Journal of Obstetrics and Gynecology (March 26, 2010) admits that legalized abortion has had "no major impact on the number of women dying. Legal abortion is now the leading cause of abortionrelated maternal deaths in the US. Every women who dies from a botched abortion is a tragic loss. But so is every child (over 64,000,000) who dies from a successful abortion. We should not make it legal to kill babies in order to make killing safer for adults! Abortion has medical and psychological risks; making it illegal would PROTECT the lives and health of millions of women.

Can God Forgive Abortion? Cont.

Jeremiah gave one of God's greatest promises to the people of Judah and Israel, "But this shall be the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel; After those days, saith the Lord, I will put my law in their inwards parts, and write it in their hearts; and will be their God, and they shall be my people. And they shall teach no more every man his neighbor, and every man his brother, saying, Know the Lord: for they shall all know me, from the least of them unto the greatest of them, saith the Lord; for I will forgive their iniquity, and I will remember their sin no more."

God promised them that there would come a day when He would not only forgive OUR sins, but He would also forget our sins!

So to answer the question: Will God forgive abortion? The answer is:

YOU DECIDE WHETHER OR NOT GOD FORGIVES YOU!

God is saying to us, both as individuals and as a nation, "you are guilty before me". How we respond to that accusation will determine our future. If we **REPENT**, we will be **FORGIVEN**. In fact, in the future, God will completely **EXPUNGE** our record when we repent.
