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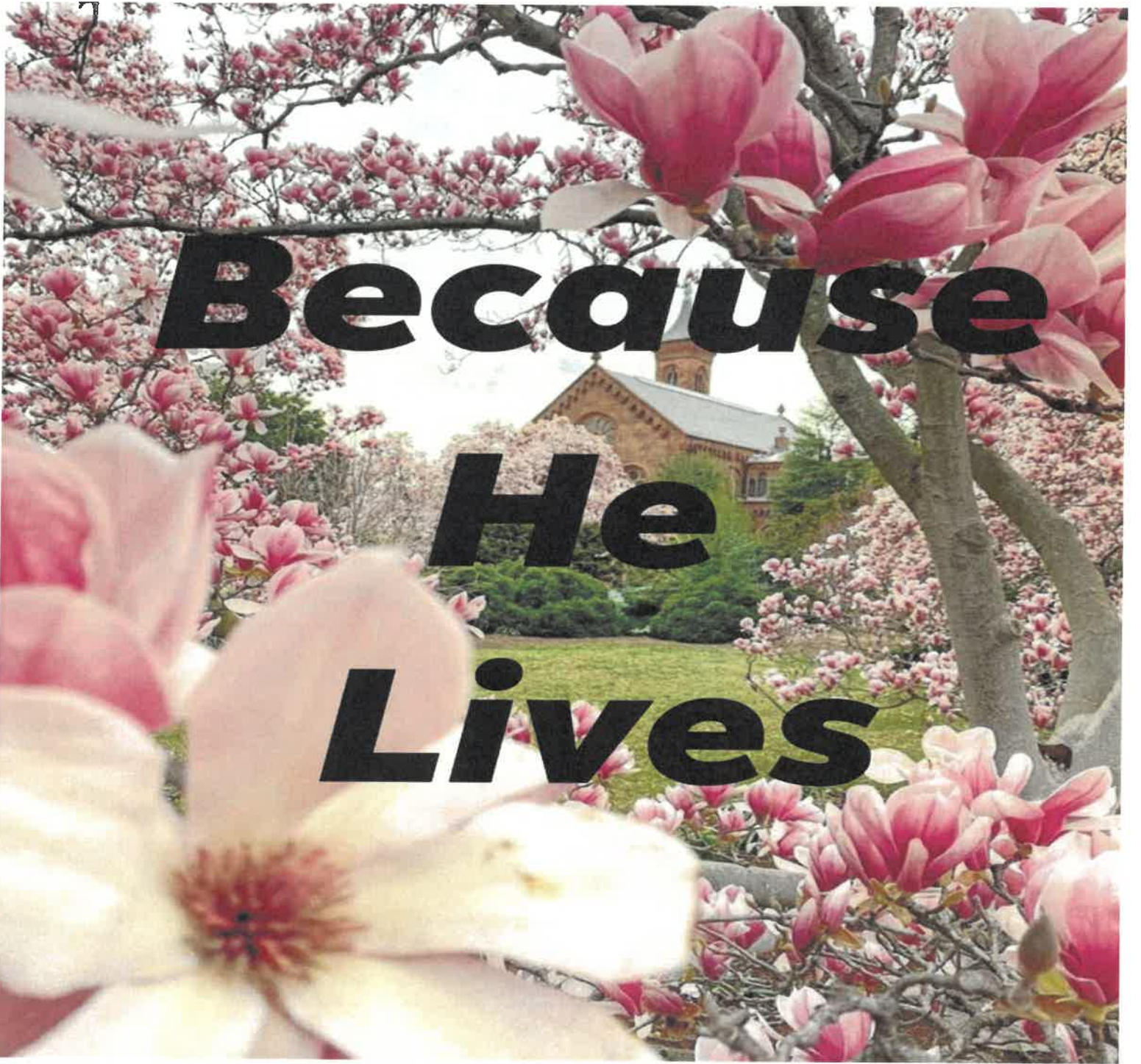

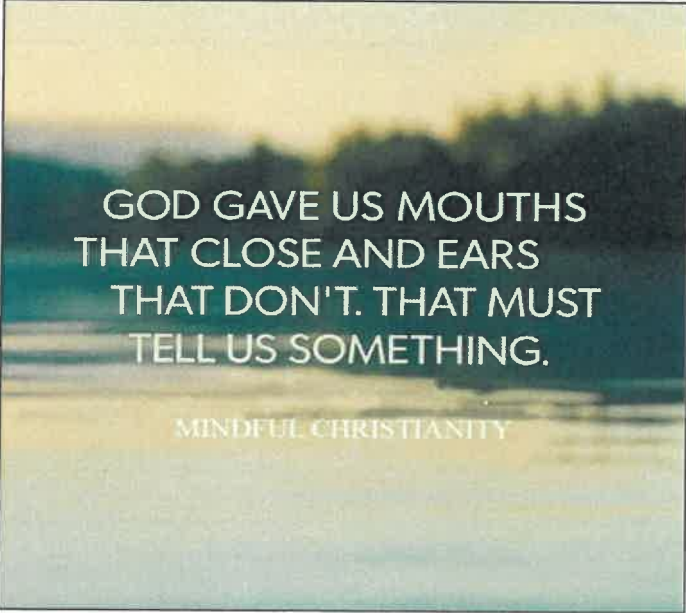

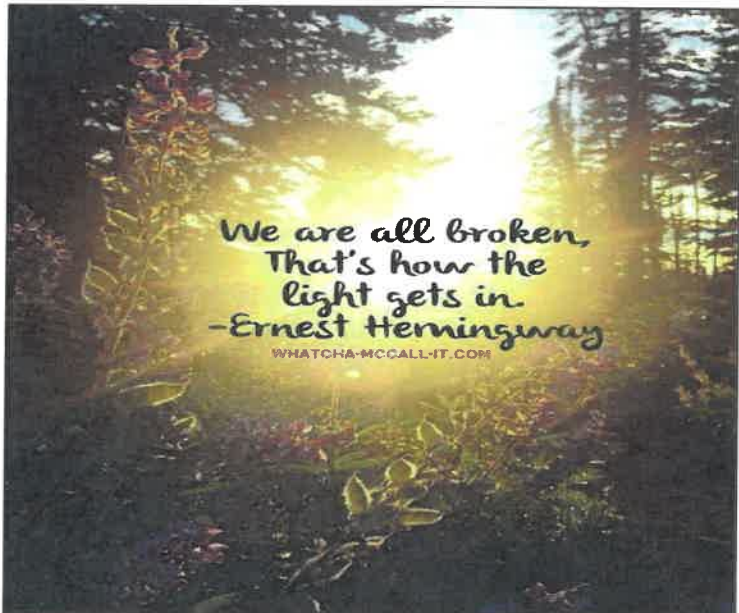

COOKIE SMILE TIPS



Transform slice-and-bake cookies into cheerful lollipop treats and share a few edible smiles.

What you need:

- 1 roll refrigerated sugar cookie dough
- Knife
- Baking sheet
- Wooden craft sticks
- Frosting
- Sprinkles
- Clear treat bags
- Ribbon



What you do:

1. Freeze the cookie dough for 15 to 20 minutes to firm it up, then slice into 1/4-inch rounds.
2. Place cookies on a baking sheet about 2 inches apart.
3. Bake at 350 degrees for 5 minutes.
4. Remove from the oven and gently press a wooden stick halfway into the bottom of each cookie.
5. Return to the oven and bake 3 to 5 more minutes, until lightly golden.
6. Let cookies cool completely.
7. Decorate with frosting to create smiling faces and add sprinkles.
8. Slip each cookie pop into a treat bag and tie with ribbon.

Make a Postcard PUZZLE

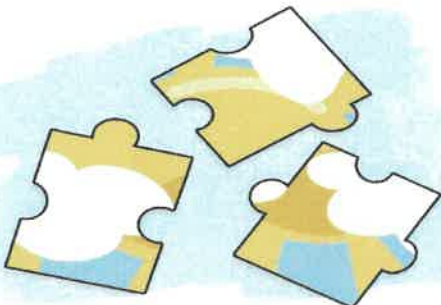
Summer is full of little moments that remind us that God is guiding each step. Like a puzzle, he brings every piece together in his time.

4. Store the pieces in an envelope so you can use it again later.



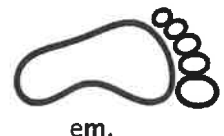
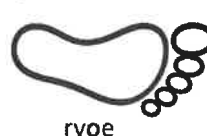
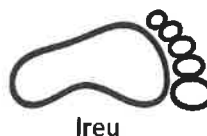
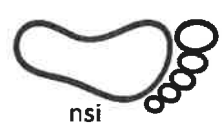
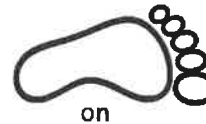
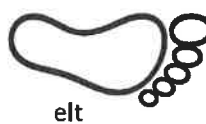
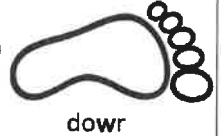
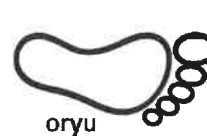
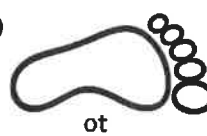
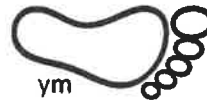
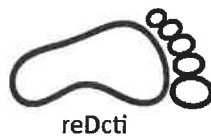

A QUARTER OF MY GENERATION IS MISSING.

Their lives were taken almost as soon as they began. They never breathed fresh air, let out their first cry, or smiled at their family. Students who should have stood beside me at graduation, people who would just be starting their careers and families, and perhaps even some of the greatest minds of our time—**all of them are missing.**

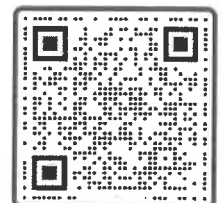

Just 85 decibels.

That's the level of sound it takes to damage your hearing—if you can't get away from the noise. The longer you are exposed, the more strain your ears sustain.

It can be hard to escape that level of noise, especially in our modern world. Many parts of our daily lives are louder than 85 decibels. Those earbuds so many of us wear, playing beautiful music to drown out the noise of life? The music can be loud enough to be damaging, too.

The noise in our lives can be just like the noise in our ears: too much (even the good stuff!), and we lose focus.

We are called to be engaged in the world around us, to be the light of life, particularly in this seemingly mad culture. So, I need you to focus. Focus on the rest of this letter. And then focus on what we need to accomplish this summer!

What's our number one issue that we must address this summer? It's an election year, again! The noisiest issue imaginable, right? But we can't let that deter us. Whichever side is more focused on their mission is going to win, and the side that gets distracted by the noise—or even worse, checks out and refuses to participate—is going to lose.

And when we lose, it's not just a matter of gas prices going up or down... it's a matter of life and death!

The State of Play

There is a lot at stake in Michigan this November. We're going to elect a new governor (finally!). We're going to elect a new U.S. Senator. Every seat of the Michigan Senate and House is up for grabs. We're also voting on two members for our Michigan Supreme Court, which is firmly in the hands of pro-abortion forces by a 6-1 majority.

The political makeup of our state could change drastically in November. That change can be for the better if we can remain focused!

What are the issues at stake? If the pro-life majority in the state House disappears, and we do not win either the state Senate or the Governor's office, **it's likely our long-standing law requiring parental consent for minor teens seeking an abortion is gone. There are also bills to legalize assisted suicide currently sitting in the state House.** If they can pass those assisted suicide bills into law, Michigan would quickly be on the road to Canadian-style euthanasia. The vulnerable in our state would be at an unprecedented risk.

We have so much to lose if we let ourselves get lost in the noise or disengage entirely.

Playing New Ads

As part of our efforts to reach the public before November, we plan to **relaunch** our “**Life. The Other Choice.**” **media campaign**. That includes both traditional broadcast media and newer streaming options.

We will also be **debuting a new ad: Hope**. The ad’s message is that **hope is a choice we all make**. A hope that encourages us to brave the noise to continue our mission of ensuring that our representatives in the halls of power reflect our life-affirming values.

Hope is essential in building a culture that provides the other choice for Life!

Your Next Play

I sincerely hope you have a wonderful summer break waiting for you! But that said, **we need to ramp up, not relent in our pro-life efforts. Our intensity must start today, not in September!**

We ask for your prayers during this busy election season. **Please pray** for our staff, pro-life candidates running campaigns, and for all of us in Michigan to remain focused on life, *not* the noise.

It is also important that you vote! In every race, including the governor’s race, the state House, the state Senate, races for U.S. Congress, and every race in between, **vote pro-life!** Your vote can help elect staunch defenders of life who will promote safeguards for women and save the unborn.

Above all else, advocate for life. With your ongoing support, we can elect leaders who support safeguards for women, stand up for parental rights, and advocate on behalf of life against the abortion lobby.

We can’t let ourselves be distracted—or discouraged—by the noise.
